Can retired classroom teachers navigate Zoom? On September 23, 2020 under the guidance of Khara Bauer, Beta Chapter Second Vice President several members had a forty-five minute practice session on Zoom. This electronic tool has become the talk of 2020 since the COVID-19 lock down and appears to be how we as an organization will be safely meeting for now.

The presentation included three sections: Settings, Account Features, and Questions. The participants were guided through assorted features, given time—to practice, and helped when needed. Microsoft 365 Teams is a free platform for arranging meetings, conducting video conferencing, and collaborating on documents. Space to save documents and the number of participants may be limited. Visit Microsoft 365 Teams for details.

GoToMeeting offers screen sharing; mobile and video conferencing; and recording and transcription services. Webinars, such *GoToMeeting*, *GoToWebinar & GoToTraining*. What to Use When, are frequently shared on this website. Cost is dependent upon the number of participants. Visit <u>GoToMeeting</u> for details.

Use a **Skype** account and the internet to make free voice or video calls to other users who are also accessing the Internet. The users can send pictures, video and other files using this service. Users only need to pay when using premium features like voice mail, SMS texts or making calls to a landline, cell or outside of Skype. Visit <u>Skype</u> for details.
