Thank a classroom teacher for her work of heart.



During the 2018 – 2019 school year, Chapter member Brenda Breffitt participated as a "Reading Buddy" for an elementary school student in the Colonial School District. She met with her reading partner at Southern Elementary School regularly throughout the school year. Brenda participated through the Ballard's Reading Buddies program, a United Way of Delaware reading and mentoring program established in honor of slain Delaware State Police Corporal Stephen Ballard, who was killed April 26, 2017, outside a Wawa in Bear, DE. Brenda and other volunteer reading partners received recognition from The United Way of Delaware, which presented the Ballard Reading Buddies program with its 2019 Volunteer Award of the Year at the annual volunteer reception in May.

Epsilon opened the 2019 – 2020 school year with a back-to-school potluck in September. We also held our annual nut sale, which funds our grant-in-aid for the purchase of books and other materials for two college students preparing for careers in education. The nuts will be delivered in time for some yummy holiday baking!

In October, chapter president Nancy Meade attended the Colonial School District's annual Teacher of the Year dinner and presented the 15 Colonial school Teachers of the Year with gift cards to be used at Staples to purchase classroom materials. Epsilon Chapter also provided information about DKG to the eligible teachers in the group, and invited them to attend a meeting to learn more about our organization. Among the recipients was Rebecca Louise Vitelli, a preschool special education teacher at the Colwyck Center, where she works with students with autism and various health and cognitive needs. Rebecca was later chosen as the 2020 Teacher of the Year for the State of Delaware!

Delta's October's meeting featured member Bonnie Lane as the speaker, and she gave a very interesting and well-researched presentation on "Women of the Revolutionary War."

Bonnie started by introducing the group to Kitty Green, a well-known "camp follower." Camp followers were women who served and traveled with the Continental Army; they made up five to ten percent of the camp.

The presentation then covered women who fought in battle and were well-known heroines. One woman, Deborah Sampson, received a military pension and was part of the "Special Forces" for George Washington. In 1982, the Massachusetts Legislature declared Sampson the official state heroine and declared May 23 "Deborah Sampson Day."

Another woman of the Revolutionary War was Nancy Morgan Hart, who fought in the mountains of Georgia. In 1997, Hart was inducted into Georgia Women of Achievement, a statewide organization dedicated to publicizing, researching, and providing educational materials about the accomplishments of outstanding women in Georgia.

Bonnie closed the presentation with "Molly Pitcher" – a story about a woman who stepped up in battle. History recognizes her to be Mary Hayes, but more recently, it has been suggested that Margaret Corbin is the real Molly Pitcher. Regardless, Margaret Corbin was an officer in the Continental Army and was buried with full military honors at West Point.

Our September meeting featured an informative and eye-opening presentation by a pharmacist from the organization Attack Addiction. He spoke to us about the dangers of students vaping and using marijuana and other drugs.

This month's guest speaker will be Representative Kim Williams, who will address issues in education.

These were the highlight for Maria Dugo, a DKG World Fellowship recipient, as she visited Beta Chapter members in Fenwick Island in June 2019. Maria, who lives in Argentina, is a student at American University enrolled in the climate law program. She has worked as a lawyer in Buenos Aires and decided to branch out into a

different area of study. Khara Bauer, former state World Fellowship Committee Chairman, contacted two WF recipients in the DC area, and Ms. Dugo enthusiastically replied. The short weekend was an international success.

World Fellowship is a DKG International program that offers scholarships to women, who are not residents of member countries, seeking further education in the United States and Can-

ada. Contributions and bequests determine the number of World Fellowship Awards given each year by the committee. Dr. Doris Person, Delaware State Organization President, currently serves on the International World Fellowship Committee. Since 1960 975 women in 122 countries have received awards totaling \$3,531,600.
